Interested in obtaining an education that will allow you to develop skills required in today's global marketplace? You will have the opportunity to interact and participate in research with a diverse faculty specializing in Hispanic linguistics, literatures, and cultures. You can also participate in summer study abroad programs in Argentina, Costa Rica, Spain, or one of the many semester-long programs offered in countries throughout the Spanish-speaking world. Many students combine Spanish with another major, such as international studies, history, English, or psychology.

COURSE OFFERINGS

In addition to Spanish language courses, a wide range of more specific courses are offered, such as Spanish for business/medical professions, film, theater, Spanish phonetics, advanced oral conversations, history and art in Spain and Latin America, women writers in the Hispanic world, trans-Atlantic studies, and applied Spanish linguistics. We even offer a concentration in secondary education that includes specialized classes in language teaching and leads to certification.
